




Oakland Zoo in Knowland Park



Expansion Area	62 acres	56 acres	- 10%
Whipsnake Habitat	36 acres	21 acres	- 42%
Native Grasslands	5.6 acres	4.4 acres	- 21%

Habitat Enhancement Plan (HEP)

- Reduces impacts to less-than-significant
- Technically feasible: "enhancement" rather than "restoration"
- → Geographically feasible: adequate area on-site
- → Financially feasible:
 - Cost estimate = \$15,000 \$85,000 per year
 - Zoo demonstrated financial capacity
 - Condition of approval requires Zoo demonstrate funding is available before City issues construction permits
- Annual Review by Parks & Rec. Advisory Comm.



Reasons for Approval

- 1. Enhance City facility by providing unique and valuable recreational and educational opportunity
- 2. Expansion area reduced from 62 acres to 56 acres
- 3. Aerial gondola: less impact than approved shuttle bus system
- 4. Vet. Hospital: provide improved animal care
- 5. Overnight camping area: provide unique experience
- 6. Perimeter fence adjustments: reduce encroachment into valuable habitat; preserve public access to scenic knolls
- 7. Public walking path: enhance public access to fire roads
- 8. Snowdown emergency access road: enhance emergency access
- 9. Consistent with Zoning and General Plan
- 10. Substantial open space would remain in Knowland Park and surrounding area
